



Understanding Success Rates and Minimum Levels of Performance

What they are and why they matter

Minimum Levels of Performance (MLPs) are used by The Skills Funding Agency (SFA) as a quality standard against which every provider receiving public funding is measured. In 2011/12 the SFA and YPLA will act jointly in applying Minimum Levels of Performance to schools with sixth forms and determining which might be issued with Notices to Improve as a result of not meeting or exceeding this key quality standard.

This training explains what MLPs are, how they are applied to programmes and how they relate to success rates. It explores how the LAT (Learner Achievement Tracker) can be used to evaluate students' performance. In addition it focuses on how MLPs have an impact on funding and curriculum planning and delivery.
